## Be on top of your children's vaccines

As children are returning to school, be sure to call the Orcas Family Health Center at 360-376-7778 or UW Medicine Orcas Island Clinic at 360-376-2561 to schedule an appointment and review the vaccines your child may need for this school year.

The Washington State Childhood Vaccine Program provides publicly purchased vaccines to participating providers for all children less than 19 years of age. The program supplies all vaccines recommended by the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) and eliminates or reduces cost barriers to receiving vaccinations. Both of the island clinics are enrolled in the Childhood Vaccine Program and receive publicly supplied vaccines at no cost for all children seen at each practice. You can learn more at:
